




\*According to the quota established by Panam Sports, there will be a maximum of 80 athletes in the artistic swimming competitions.

Athletes may register for more than one event.

8 (eight) teams with a maximum of 9 (nine) athletes, each (including one reserve) may participate in the team competition.

**NOCs may register up to two (2) men included in the established quota to participate in the team event.**


12 duets with a maximum of 24 athletes (no reserves will be allowed) may participate in the duet competition.

As Host Country, Chile automatically will qualify 1 team and 1 duet with a total of 9 athletes.

## ***Athlete eligibility***

The athletes must have signed and submitted the Athlete Eligibility Condition Form.  
All participating athletes must be at least 15 years old on December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023

A competitor's nationality will be determined according to Panam Sports Regulations.



Only NOCs recognized by Panam Sports whose National Swimming Federations are affiliated with the International Swimming Federation (FINA) and Panam Aquatics may enter athletes in the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games.


To be eligible for participation in the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games, a competitor must comply with Panam Sports Regulations, FINA rules and must be entered by his or her NOC.

## Confirmation of quota places

Panam Aquatics will confirm to Panam Sports and to the NOCs the places they have qualified by July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

The NOCs will confirm to Panam Sports and to Panam Aquatics the places they will use by July 14<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

## Reallocation of unused quota places


If necessary, Panam Aquatics will reallocate unused quota places to the next best NOC positioned in the corresponding event. This process must be finalized by July 17<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

The NOCs that receive reallocated quotas must confirm their participation no later than on July 19<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

## Qualification for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games

In Artistic Swimming, the gold medalist in the team and duet events will qualify directly for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.



As Host Country, if not already qualified, Chile will automatically qualify one diver or one team to compete in each of the diving competition events, for the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games. Such divers will not count in the calculation of Zone 1 divers under the Qualification System below.

According to the quota established by Panam Sports, the maximum number of male and female diving competitors will be 74 athletes to be qualified and 6 athletes that qualified in the Cali 2021 Junior Pan American Games.



Each NOC may enter a maximum of ten divers comprised of five men and five women if entering teams in synchronized diving. NOCs not entering divers in synchronized diving will be allowed to enter a maximum of six divers, 3 men and 3 women.

The divers who qualified at the Cali 2021 Junior Pan American Games will not be included in the team (NOC) quota of 10 if they participate only in the event in which they qualified in Cali, however, if they dive in any other event, they shall be included in the maximum team quota of 10 divers.

All NOCs may enter a maximum of two divers per individual event and one team per synchronized event, except for NOCs that have qualified a diver through the Junior Pan American Games. NOCs that qualified a diver at the Junior Pan American Games may have a maximum of three divers per individual preliminary event provided that only the top two divers in the preliminary event from such NOC may qualify for the final.

## Athlete eligibility

The athletes must have signed and submitted the Athlete Eligibility Condition Form.

Only NOCs recognized by Panam Sports whose National Federations are affiliated with FINA and the Panam Aquatics, may enter competitors in the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games.


To be eligible for participation in the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games, a competitor must comply with Panam Sports Regulations, FINA rules and must be entered by his or her NOC.

Athletes younger than the age of 14 on December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023, will not be permitted to compete at the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games. (Eligible athletes must have been born in 2009 or earlier).

If the named athletes cannot participate in the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games, the place will be lost. The lost place may not be transferred to the athlete's NOC or to any other athlete.

Athletes who qualified in the Cali 2021 Games are additional to the NOC quota in the event qualified. The NOC is entitled to qualify other places according to the following qualification system in addition to the Cali 2021 qualified athletes.

**If an athlete who qualified in the Cali 2021 Games competes in any other event than the event qualified in the Cali 2021 Games, such athlete will count towards the maximum team quota for his or her NOC.**

Please note that, Cali 2021 qualified athletes are not eligible to qualify a country place for their NOC in the event they qualified in Cali 2021, as noted in the table above, since they are already qualified for the Santiago 2023 Games.

## **Qualification system**

NOCs may only send competitors to the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games who have qualified through the system established by Panam Aquatics and **AQUA (previously FINA)**.

The objective is to have the top ranked Panam Aquatics divers within **AQUA** compete at the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games.

Those divers who have achieved a ranking **at the AQUA World Championships** may earn a quota position for their NOC. In addition, at each of the CONSANAT Championships (Zone 1) and the PAQ Qualifying Diving Championships (Zone 2), divers from federations competing in such events may earn a quota position for their NOCs. Additional divers from other Zones may qualify quota positions **at the PAQ Qualifying Diving Championships** but may be subject to Reallocation of Unused Quota Places outlined below.

### List of proposed divers / Long List

Each NOC must submit a long list with the names of the proposed divers to be registered for the Santiago 2023 Pan Am Games to Panam Aquatics and Panam Sports no later than July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2023. The Panam Aquatics TDC will review the divers to ensure that they are the top ranked Panam Aquatics divers within **AQUA** or have qualified in accordance with the following events:


### Athlete Quota Numbers by Zone (74 Athletes Total)

**Zone 1** – minimum of 20 divers, each federation within Zone 1 limited to a maximum of 10 divers; in addition CHI will have a maximum of 10 divers as host nation.

**Zone 2** – minimum of 20 divers, each federation within Zone 2 limited to a maximum of 10 divers.

**Zone 3** – maximum 10 divers

**Zone 4** – maximum 10 divers



It is important to note that the quota positions for each of Zones 1 and 2 earned through rankings **at AQUA World Championships** will have priority and any diver from that zone ranked within **AQUA** will count towards the minimum quota numbers for such Zone at its Zone qualification event.

Note: Zone 3 and 4 divers do not have separate qualifiers within their zones. National championships or trials events in Zones 3 and 4 may be used to name divers to already qualified positions.

### **Confirmation of quota places**

Panam Aquatics shall confirm to Panam Sports and NOCs the places qualified by the NOCs no later than August 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

NOCs shall confirm to Panam Sports and Panam Aquatics the places they will use no later than August 14<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

All NOCs must submit their entry by number and long list by the established deadline, July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2023. In the long list, NOCs can enter all possible athletes who may qualify and participate in the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games.

### **Reallocation of unused quota places**

If necessary, Panam Aquatics will determine the qualified divers for the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games according to the priority ranking system outlined above no later than August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

If the number of proposed divers exceeds the quota of 74, Panam Aquatics will determine the qualified divers for the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games according to the following priority ranking system:



- a) **Priority one** — FINA World Ranking at the end of 2022. FINA World Ranking 2023 may be used to add divers not ranked in 2022.
- b) **Priority two** — Place finish in the **PAQ Qualifying Diving Championships**.
- c) **Tiebreaker system** — if a tie occurs, provided the PAQ Qualifying Diving Championships invites all Zones to participate, the highest finish for an athlete that has not qualified. If the 2023 PAQ Diving Championships is not held or does not invite all Zones, the following system will be used to break the tie: most number of top 12 place finishes in FINA events from 2021 to 2023.

If there is still a tie, then the highest ranked average of finish, followed by the next ranking consideration is used: most number of top 12 place finishes in Panam Aquatics events from 2021 to 2023.

If there is still a tie, then the final ranking consideration is used: federations without competitors will be invited first and any further considerations will be determined by any head-to-head results, as interpreted by the Panam Aquatics TDC in its sole discretion, specifically including the 2023 CCAN Championships provided all Panam Aquatics federations in good standing are permitted to attend.


In exceptional circumstances (where an athlete is unable to attend the qualification event for good reason), an application may be made to PAQ DC and if any quota places remain after the AQUA World Championships in Fukuoka, athletes who demonstrate a high ranking in the Americas through high quality events may be deemed to have qualified at a Priority two level.

NOCs that received reallocated places must confirm their participation by August 17<sup>th</sup>, 2023.


### ***Qualification for Paris 2024 Olympic Games***

The Diving competition at the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games will serve as a qualifier for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.


The continental champions in the individual events of 3m springboard and 10m platform in both genders will qualify a position for their respective National Federation if they have not otherwise qualified a position in that event, with official with entries to be confirmed by the respective NOCs.

## ***Athlete eligibility***

The athletes must have signed and submitted the Athlete Eligibility Condition Form.


All participating athletes must be at least 14 years old. Athletes born in 2009 or before.

A competitor's nationality will be determined according to Panam Sports Regulations, Section IV, item 3.

For the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games, NOCs will only be permitted to enter athletes who have qualified in accordance with the qualification system established by PanAm Aquatics described below.

Only NOCs recognized by Panam Sports whose swimming National Federations are affiliated with FINA and PanAm Aquatics, may enter competitors in the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games.

To be eligible for participation in the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games, a competitor must comply with Panam Sports Regulations, FINA rules and must be entered by his or her NOC.



## Qualification system

The qualification positions will be determined as follows.

Each zone will be responsible for the organization of its own qualification competition.

Each zone must provide the PanAm Aquatics President, PanAm Aquatics Secretary - Treasurer and the Vice Chairperson of the PanAm Aquatics Technical Open Water Swimming Committee with a complete set of results, including the date and location of the qualification competition, as well as names of the qualifying athletes.

### Zone I CONSANAT

Those NOCs whose athletes obtain the first eight places (per gender) in the qualification competition will qualify for the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games.


The qualification competition will take place on **October 1<sup>st</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022, in the South American Games (ODESUR Games)**. Each Federation will be limited to two athletes per gender.

If Chile does not have an athlete finish in the top eight places, then their lead finisher representing Chile will be awarded eighth place. This qualification competition will be under control of FINA and Confederación Sudamericana de Natación (CONSANAT).

### Zone II CCCAN

Those NOCs whose athletes obtain the first eight places (per gender) in the 2023 CAC Games will qualify for the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games.

The qualification competition will take place on **June 23<sup>rd</sup> – July 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023, in the Central American and Caribbean Games**. Each Federation will be limited to two athletes per gender.



### Zone III USA

The USA will conduct their own internal processes and register up to two men and two women in each event.

The qualification competition will take place sometime between March to June 2023 and will be confirmed to PanAm Aquatics by [date to be confirmed], 2023.

### Zone IV CAN

Canada will conduct their own internal processes and register up to two men and two women in each event.

The qualification competition will take place in or around April 2023, in Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands and will be confirmed to PanAm Aquatics by [date to be confirmed], 2023.

## ***Rules Governing the Swimming Competition***

Per Article 52 of the PanAm Aquatics Constitution, the FINA Handbook, 2022-2025 will govern the competition, with such amendments as the PanAm Aquatics Executive Committee may consider to be necessary to adopt such rules and regulations to its continental championship, specifically including the following substitution for FINA GR 9.3

### ***GR 9.3 Jury of Appeal***

GR 9.3.1 For the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games, the Jury of Appeal shall be composed of the Executive Committee of the PanAm Aquatics, the Honorary Members present and the FINA delegate present with the President of PanAm Aquatics or in his absence a Vice President, as Chairman. Each member shall have one vote, except as provided hereunder, and in case of equality of voting, the Chairman has a casting vote.

GR 9.3.2 A jury member is allowed to speak, but not to vote, on a case in which the interest of his own Federation is involved. A jury member having acted as an official is not allowed to vote on a case if there is a protest against his decision or on his interpretation of a Rule. In case of urgency, the jury may vote on a matter even if it has not been possible to call all the members. The decision of the jury is final.

## ***Athlete eligibility***

The athletes must have signed and submitted the Athlete Eligibility Condition Form.


Only NOCs recognized by Panam Sports whose swimming National Federations are affiliated with FINA and PanAm Aquatics, may enter competitors in the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games ("Santiago 2023").

To be eligible for participation in the Santiago 2023, an athlete must comply with Panam Sports Regulations, FINA rules and must be entered by his or her NOC.

An athlete's nationality will be determined according to Panam Sports Regulations and FINA General Rule 2.

The minimum age for swimmers competing in Santiago 2023 shall be the same as the minimum age for the FINA World Junior Swimming Championships.

Women 14 years and Men 15 years of age on December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023, EXCEPT younger competitors may participate in these championships if they have achieved at least the (PST / "B" Time) standard entry time in a respective event.



## ***Cali 2021 Quotas***



*If the named athletes cannot participate in Santiago 2023, the place will be lost. The lost place may not be transferred to the athlete's NOC or to any other athlete.*


The NOC's quota, in any event, does not include athletes who qualified at the Cali 2021. The NOC is entitled to qualify other places according to the following qualification system in addition to the Cali 2021 qualified athletes.

NOTE: \*\*The following athletes are specifically invited to compete by virtue of their Gold Medal achievement at Cali 2021. These specific athletes may be entered in addition to the maximum NOC quota and the maximum event-specific quota above. If these athletes choose not to compete, absolutely no substitutions are permitted.

NOCs that qualified a swimmer from Cali 2021 may have a maximum of three swimmers per individual event provided that only the two fastest swimmers from the preliminaries may qualify for the A final in Santiago 2023.

## Qualification system

Qualification period: March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022– August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023.

As Host Country, Chile automatically will qualify 18 male and 18 female athletes.

NOCs may only send athletes to Santiago 2023 who have qualified through the system established by Panam Aquatics and FINA.

Each National Olympic Committee (NOC) may use proven swim times attained during the qualification period of those swimmers who have met the qualifying standards established by PanAm Aquatics for Santiago 2023.

Panam Aquatics has established the following criteria for events eligible to be used as qualifying events for these games: FINA World Championships; Continental Championships; Continental Qualification Events; National Championships and Trials and other Qualification Events approved by PanAm Aquatics. For additional events please submit the request **in advance of the competition** to [santiago2023@panamaquatics.com](mailto:santiago2023@panamaquatics.com)

The priority order for qualification and selection into Santiago 2023 will be:

1. All athletes with Pan American Games Qualifying (PQT) "A" time
2. Relay only athletes
3. Universality places
4. Invited athletes who have achieved a Pan American Games Selection (PST) "B" time

### Pan Am Qualifying Time (PQT / "A" Time) and Pan Am Selection Time (PST / "B" Time)

For each individual event at the Pan American Games, PanAm Aquatics will establish standard entry times of two (2) types: a "PanAm Qualifying Time" (PQT / "A" Time) and a "PanAm Selection Time" (PST / "B" Time) of which the PST / "B" Time shall be easier to achieve. Standard entry times can only be achieved in competitions approved for that purpose by PanAm Aquatics during the qualification period from March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022, to August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023.


### Athletes who have achieved the Pan Am Qualifying Time (PQT / "A" Time)

Athletes who achieve the PQT / "A" Time in one or more individual events are automatically qualified to participate in Santiago 2023.

NOCs can enter two (2) athletes in the same event, only if both athletes have achieved the PQT / "A" Time. There is the possibility of a third athlete entry should that athlete be an automatic qualifier indicated on the list above.

### Invited athletes who have achieved a Pan Am Selection Time (PST / "B" Time)

Following the end of the qualification period and if the quota of 350 athletes is not reached, PanAm Aquatics will assess the number of athletes having achieved the PQT / "A" Time, the number of Relay-Only athletes and the number of Universality Places.



PanAm Aquatics will then invite athletes who have achieved an PST / "B" time, until the total quota of 350 athletes is reached. PST places will be distributed by event, according to the position on the FINA World Ranking of 1 August 2023.

NOCs can only enter one (1) athlete per event having achieved a PST / "B" Time. Athletes invited through PST/"B" time are allowed to compete in a maximum of five individual events inclusive of the event in which their selection was based provided that NOC has an opening in that specific event. The rule of a maximum of two entries per event per NOC still applies, and these athletes cannot enter an event that already has one athlete from that NOC in that event (unless both athletes have "A" qualifying times in that event).

### Universality

NOCs with no athletes who have achieved an PQT / "A" Time, or a PST / "B" time may enter a maximum of one (1) man and one (1) woman.

NOCs with athletes having achieved an PQT / "A" time or selected by PanAm Aquatics for an PST / "B" time only in one (1) gender may also enter one (1) universality athlete in the other gender.

Under the universality rule, each NOC is guaranteed an entry of one male and/or one female athlete, each of whom may enter a maximum of three individual events, without having a qualifying time for any event.

A NOC that enters universality athletes at Santiago 2023 is not eligible to enter mixed-gender relays and therefore cannot enter relay-only athletes.


Universality places must be on the long list and registered by the NFs in the OME System.

Universality places should be requested no later than August 7<sup>th</sup>, 2023 to PanAm Aquatics and Panam Sports to the following emails: [santiago2023@panamaquatics.com](mailto:santiago2023@panamaquatics.com) and [andrea@panamsports.org](mailto:andrea@panamsports.org)

Universality places and universality athlete names are not final until PanAm Aquatics completes the PST / "B" allocation and reallocation process. During that process, PanAm Aquatics will reallocate, as required, quota spots to the NOCs with guaranteed universality quota spots remaining and request the NOC confirm the name of the athlete(s) occupying those spot(s) (no more than one male and/or female athlete per NOC, according to the universality rule).

### Relays

Each NOC may enter one team in each relay event, provided it has at least two athletes with PQT / "A" Time, or a PST / "B" standards that have been invited to compete at Santiago 2023. Each NOC will be allowed a maximum of two relay-only swimmers per gender. All other relay participants must be entered in at least one individual event. **Any swimmer entered in an individual event may swim in any relay and does not need a qualifying time in the particular stroke/distance to be swim in the relay to do so.** Relay-only athletes are only eligible to swim in the relay(s) and will not be permitted to swim in any individual events. A relay-only athlete must participate in at least one relay.



Each team is allowed to have two-relay only swimmers of each gender within their team quota allotment, but each of these swimmers must swim in the heat or final of at least one relay and must have a PQT / "A" Time, or a PST / "B" qualifying time in the stroke/distance that he/she would swim in a relay. Should a relay-only swimmer not compete, this will lead to the disqualification of the respective team. Further, if a relay-only swimmer does not compete in the heats of a relay in which the NOC fails to qualify for the finals, the relay will be disqualified. If a relay-only swimmer could swim in multiple relays but does not compete in any for which he/she is eligible, the final relay for which he/she was eligible will be the relay that is disqualified.

If a relay-only swimmer is medically unable to compete, they may be excused from the requirement to participate in a relay. A member of the Panam Sports Medical Commission or their Designee will be present at heats and finals and will be the independent physician empowered to make decisions about relay-only athlete participation.

The physician designated by the Panam Sports Medical Commission and Panam Aquatics has final authority to make decisions about an athlete's non-participation due to injury or illness (particularly related to relay-only athlete participation in relays, but not limited to this), and to make decisions about permissible use of taping on the bodies of competing athletes.

The relay participants may be completely different between Heats and Finals, with up to eight different swimmers.

A NOC that enters universality athletes at the Santiago 2023 is not eligible to enter mixed-gender relays and therefore cannot enter relay-only athletes.

### ***Panam Aquatics Online Meet Entry System***

Swimming entries for Santiago 2023 will first be processed by PanAm Aquatics through its OME system. PanAm Aquatics will provide each **National Federation** with an OME system username and password and an OME users' guide (English and Spanish) for the Santiago 2023.

This information will be distributed on **April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023**, to the National Federations and NOCs.

The OME entry system opens at 1000 (CT) – **April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023**.


The OME entry system closes at 23:59 (CT) – August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, at 23:59 (CT).

PAQ online meet entry system completes with swimmer lists and entries per event – **August 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2023**.

**NOTE:** Entry by number and the long list should be submitted in the Santiago 2023 system by the NOCs on time, which is before July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

### ***Confirmation of quota places***

Panam Aquatics shall confirm to Panam Sports and NOCs the places qualified by the NOCs no later than August 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023, subject to reallocating or allocating universality places.



NOCs shall confirm to Panam Sports and Panam Aquatics the places they will use no later than August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023, subject to reallocating or allocating universality places.

### ***Reallocation of unused quota places***

If necessary, PanAm Aquatics will complete the quota according to the following order:

1. Invited athletes who have achieved a Pan American Games Selection (PQT) "A" time
2. Invited athletes who have achieved a Pan American Games Selection (PST) "B" time
3. Reallocation of Pan American Games Selection (PST) "B" time
4. Universality places


This process will start from August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

NOCs that received reallocated places must confirm their participation by September 19<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

### ***Qualification for Paris 2024 Olympic Games***

Swimming athletes can achieve the standards to qualify for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games at this Pan American Games.






